What is a suite?

A suite is a collection of dances in the same key. Each movement contrasts in tempo and time signature making each dance

The movements are as follows:

I. Entree et Rondeau

II. Tambourin

III. Musette

IV. Serenade

V. Fanfare

VI. Rondeau

VII. Menuets

VIII. Le Coucou

Other Facts

The music of this suite originated as background music for a French ballet production of *Romeo* and *Juliette*. (Milhaud did much composing for stage productions)

This suite by Milhaud is reminiscent of a 18th century Baroque suite. It is considered Neobaroque.

The title translates as: "suite after Corrette." Michel Corrette was a 18th-century composer.

Le Coucou

Milhaud had much fun writing the final movement, Le Coucou. It is meant to sound like a cuckoo bird.
